All four schools we are currently focusing on are located in the Limpopo Province of South Africa, situated in the northern part of the country. The province is named after the Limpopo River, which forms the border between South Africa and Zimbabwe. South Africa recognizes eleven official languages, and in Limpopo, the predominant languages are Shangaan, Venda, and Sepedi.

These schools are part of South Africa’s formal education system and are overseen by the Department of Education. For logistical and cost-efficiency reasons, we have grouped the schools by region. The current group is in a Sepedi-speaking area.

‘Adopt a School’

Malekapane Primary School (Project to start on the 28th June 2025)
Polokwane, Limpopo, South Africa

The Principal is Mrs Mphahlele and she has a total staff of 9 some of whom are volunteers from the local community.

The school starts from Grade 1 to Grade 7 and has a total of 97 Learners/Children ranging from 7-14 years of age. The school has 38 girls and 59 boys.

The main project currently underway is the re-building of the kitchen from which the school prepares the food provided by government. For many of the children this will be the main - if not the only - meal for the day.



The main challenge with this school is that the school is old and mostly built with mud bricks. The temporary classrooms provided by the Government are also now in a state of disrepair.

Necessary work required:

The current kitchen and the Principal office is built with mud and stones. The Principal started a project to manufacture the bricks.

Cost - The full replacement of the block is estimated at €2,000- €4,000

Full ceiling needed and tiling of the permanent classrooms is required in order to ensure that the children and staff can have a more comfortable and inhabitable environment in which to learn and teach

Cost - €1,000

Plastering of some walls

Cost - €1,000

Decoration / painting of walls

Cost - €1,500

Additional ‘wish’ list: requires further investment and ongoing partnership

- Development of a vegetable garden to compliment the government supplies – the initiative would be to teach the staff, children and parents to develop and tend for the garden. It will also give the school the opportunity to be self sufficient
- To ‘furnish’ the kitchen

Madisei Primary School
Mashite, South Africa
Exclusive Partnership rate @ €28,000

The Principal is Mr Radebe. There are a total of thirteen staff, some of which are volunteers from the local community.

The school starts from Grade 1 to Grade 7 and has a total 296 pupils ranging from 7 - 14 years of age. There are 146 girls and 150 boys.



The main challenge with this this school is the limited resources for the maintenance of the school. They are also restricted by lack of space and will require a new block for classrooms:

Necessary work required:

Construction and build of a block of x3 permanent classrooms
Cost - €6,700 (includes all materials and labour)

Construction and build of kitchen
Cost - €6,700 (includes all materials and labour)

Painting of external and internal walls
Cost - €1,034

Construction of fencing around the school perimeter
Cost - €4,075

School uniforms for children who do not have the means to pay for the uniform x40
Cost - €1,070

Additional ‘wish’ list – requires further investment and ongoing partnership:

- AV equipment including laptops and projectors
- **Rebuilding of school library – project has been ‘adopted’ by Specialist Printing Worldwide**

Batau Primary School

Pretoria, Limpopo, South Africa

Exclusive Partnership rate @ €28,000

The principal is Mrs Mokabane. There are a total of 13 staff comprising of both full-time teachers and volunteers from the local community.

The school starts from Grade 1 to Grade 7 and has a total 394 of pupils from 7 - 14 years of age. The school has 167 girls and 227 boys.

Due to the fence being completely damaged, animals, in particular cows, roam around the school disrupting the daily lessons and limiting the outside space that the pupils can occupy. As a result of the broken fence, it is also difficult to control access to the school, leaving the school and pupils vulnerable to criminal elements around the area.

The school comprises of “temporary” classrooms which are dilapidated. This school also requires construction of further classrooms and a kitchen

The main challenge with this this school is overcrowding and the lack of facilities for the maintenance of the buildings and the perimeter fence:

Necessary work required:

The construction and build of x3 permanent classrooms

Cost - €6,700 (includes all materials and labour)

The construction and build of school kitchen

Cost - €6,700 (includes all materials and labour)

Construction of fencing around the school perimeter to stop neighbouring cattle hurds coming onto school land

Cost - €4,075

School uniforms for children who do not have the means to pay for the uniform x40

Cost - €1,070

Painting of external and internal walls

Cost - €1,400

Additional wish list – requires further investment and ongoing partnership:

- Help with development of playground and sports kits for the children. The school is dedicated to sport, and this would align with their vision for their pupils
- Vegetable garden (as before)

Pitseng ya Thuto Primary School
Turfpan, South Africa

The Principal is Mr Mamosebo and he has a total staff of 16 staff members, excluding the nonteaching staff.

The school starts from Grade 1 to Grade 7 and has 330 of Learners/Children ranging from 7 - 14 years. The school has 149 girls and 181 boys.

This facility also has sections of it that are face brick walled but the inside of the classrooms and the outside plastered portions need to be painted, and doors fixed.

The main challenge with this school is the kitchen and the maintenance of the buildings:

Necessary worked required:

Painting of external and internal walls

Cost - €1,400

Chalk board lines for x13 classrooms

Cost - €670

Full kitchen renovation including ceiling and walls

Cost - €800

Full school uniforms for girls and boys x40

Cost - €1,070

Additional ‘wish’ list: requires further investment and ongoing partnership:

- School furniture including tables and chairs
